## 1. What is the role of the family in society?

The family is the basic unit of society, and remains the deepest bond between a man and a woman. It should provide a unit of personal love and care, sensitive child-raising and sincere communication. No other forms of social organization have proven to be more effective or stable than the monogamous relationship of a man and woman. In those times when families work well, societies will work well, too. On the contrary, when families start to weaken, societies also become unstable. Over the past several decades the family - as a unit - has been under serious attack. The values of the traditional family model have been exteremely undermined. Though the reasons for the current crisis in the family structure are many and complex, some of the major causes are the following: both parents working outside the home, the increasing unemployment rate, the spread of consumerism, the prevailing influence of cultural liberalism, including the promotion of the rights of homosexuals as well as many other causes.

## 2. What is the role of Christian families in these difficult times?

Christian families are called to live and convey gospel values both in society and in their immediate surroundings. They are called, in other words, to be God's light to the whole world. In the present times, when traditional moral values are so much discredited, Christian families must continue to love and teach these values. Just as children learn by imitation, so

do adults. Christian families must present a good and authentic model, so that other families can base their lives on them. In the context of marriage love presents itself in different ways – in the love for children, in the love found between the husband and wife, and in the love instilled by the parents in their children for Christian values.

In addition, Christians must show that in a fruitful, sacramental marriage, there is no place for extramarital relationships and that abortions are treated as anti-life because they take innocent lives.

## 3. What is the importance of sacramental marriage?

The sacramental marriage of a man and a woman represents the model of love between Christ and his Church. The image of marriage is used all throughout Scripture. First it is used in the story of creation and then culminates in the New Testament, in the marriage between Christ and his bride, the Church. Christ loves his Church with the deep and abiding love of a bridegroom for his bride so much, that he was willing to sacrifice His life for her. As Christ continues to love the Church, so should a husband love his wife and, following the same logic, so should a wife love her husband. The spouses' mutual love, which involves both in a total gift of self, must be renewed day by day, and be based on a constant spirit of sacrifice. This unique relationship is depicted throughout the Old-Testament (see CCC 1611 and the footnote referencing to Hosea, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekial), but perhaps most strikigly in the 'Song of Songs', a part of the wisdom literature of the Old-Testament which puts before the reader' eyes two lovers who are in perfect harmony. Besides the literal meaning though, there exists a deeper allegorical one: the lovers' relationship symbolizes the love between God and his People, the Church.

Because the safest guarantee for general social stability can be found in the strong Christian family model, it should be seen as a priceless legacy that should both be guarded and handed down from generation to generation.
